## **Apparel and Textile Production I & II-Mrs. Kelvington**

The following materials will be due **August 26th/27th:** 

- A separate 1 ½-2" 3-ring binder (These will be kept in the classroom the majority of the year.)
- At least four notebook dividers
- 100 Index Cards 5" x 3" (Cut these in half before you bring them in, or buy 200 of the 2.5" x 3" cards.)
- Pencils/pens
- Notebook paper

The following materials will be due **September 3rd/4th:** 

- Two yards of cotton or cotton blend <u>solid color</u> fabric—not too thin, I will show examples in class (should be inexpensive and for practice)
- 1 large spool of thread of a color that contrasts to the fabric (all purpose/bring in thread you may have at home as long as there is enough to work with)
- Two 7" nylon zippers of any color. No invisible zippers!

These materials may be found in a kit at a fabric store, or you may buy a la carte:

- Dressmaker shears
- Pin cushion
- Dressmaker's silk pins
- Hand sewing needles
- Seam ripper

The following items are **optional** as I have plenty to share:

- Dressmaker's tracing paper and tracing wheel
- Tape measure
- Sewing gauge-six inch
- Tailor's chalk or chalk pencil
- Buttons- 1 shank, 1 regular (If you choose to bring these, please bring them in a Ziploc. If you do not have these, do not buy them. I have lots of extra.)

## **Costume Design**

Materials above (minus index cards) and a sketchbook of choice

Fabric, notions (thread, zipper, button, etc.) and interfacing must be supplied by the student at designated times during each nine week period. Students may order patterns by bringing in a couple of dollars at designated times. <u>If there is a problem getting these materials, parents should contact me at lindsayk.kelvington@cms.k12.nc.us or send in a note.</u>

When used properly, and students keep up with their materials, most supplies can last for years to come.
